ABUSE OF THE ELDERLY

<u>SEE</u>

It was reported in the Straits Times dated July 10 2023 that about one in 10 applications for a personal protection order (PPO) was by parents seeking security from their own children. The paper further stated that this figure has remained "relatively constant over the past five years".

Abuse of the elderly can be physical, emotional, non-verbal, or neglect. Apart from children, the culprits can be the siblings, caregivers. Caregivers can be relatives or the domestic maid.

The above paper also reported the following cases:

Case One:

A 15-year old boy, diagnosed with social anxiety, was having a turbulent time at school. Not only did he get in trouble with his teachers for turning up late for school and not doing his homework, but he also had conflicts with his friends. Eventually, he stopped attending school. His parents tried to talk to him, but to no avail. One day, as his mother was telling him that he was making her life difficult he hit her on the head.

Case Two:

A 15-year old teen was so immersed in the world of gaming that he stopped going to school. One night, his father asked him to go out with the family for dinner. When the teen did not respond, his father threatened to turn off the house's wi-fi. The boy, who towered over his father and weighed over 100kg, retaliated by pushing the older man to the ground.

Case: Three:

A 14-year old boy with an internet gaming disorder harboured thoughts of killing his father for restricting his access to computer games. He eventually stabbed his father in the neck and the father died. The boy was accordingly charged and convicted and sentenced to five years' detention.

Apart from physical and mental illnesses, financial difficulties, lack of regular communication and quality time spent with children can also give rise to frictions between parents and children. Overloading the domestic helper with household work and treating the helper unreasonably can also cause the helper to break down. Care-givers can really be "burnt out".

According to La Croix International (publication dated 15 November 2023) the World Health Organization estimates that 1 in 6 people aged over 60 suffers from abuse – that means nearly 141 million people globally. This number might be much higher as abuse of the elderly is often hidden and under – reported.
