CFSM Annual Report 2019

In keeping to its charism and mission, the CFSM continues its effort to help families in the faith formation and to promote a lay apostolate centred around the Christian family. Working on the theme of "Challenges to restore our human dignity through the Family in Modern Society" the movement continues its effort in building a community of God's people in the midst of the challenges in the modern society. The following are some of our activities:

1. The Neighbourhood Parish Group Gatherings

The Movement, through the monthly neighbourhood of 14 parish groups gatherings continues the faith formation of its members and community-building. Families gather to reflect on the issues of life as a Christian adult, a citizen, and parent in Singapore by using our CFSM Social Enquiry booklet and various publications from the Church.

These meetings/fellowship sessions enable our members to reflect issues in our lives in the light of our Catholic faith and the discussions are meant to help guide them in their life's actions. The meetings also help families (parents & children) to grow closer as Catholic communities in both their social and spiritual dimensions.

2. Feast of St Joseph The Worker (1st May 2019):

The session discussed the challenges faced by workers in organizations that is very focussed on the bottomline. Singapore families and migrant workers also face challenges from the high cost of living, but through ROL, enabled the members to see Work and Families from all angles and reflect that the cost of living is also driven up by choice of lifestyle. The session and the event was attended by 30 members, including several migrant workers.

3. Movement Outing - to Kranji Sungei Buloh/Wetland (15 Jun 2019)

Total attendance was 25 people attending. 9 children, 11 adults and 5 EXCO. President, Francis Mane gave an eye-opening briefing of the flora and fauna of the wetlands. The session brought to the participants' attention the eological impact of pollution (in line with Ladato Si).

4. Formation Session – "Restoring our Dignity from Genesis" (2nd November 2018)

Using the scripture passages from Genesis, Fr Bruno explained our role in enhancing creation and there were many ancient Hebrew practices that were not in line with the commandments of God. The session was featured in the Catholic News.
