

"Webinar" is now the by-word of most organizations including CFM and the succeeding slides are the activities we have done so far this year.




The 1st Webinar that CFM has done thru Grace Marquez, Formation Committee chairperson, with husband Joey Marquez on May 9, 2020.






Bp. Gerardo Alminaza, CFM National Chaplain was next to give a talk May 30, 2020.








Msgr. Manuel Gabriel, CFM Asst. National Chaplain, delivered a recollection on June 13, 2020.



CFM Spirituality of Stewardship (SoS) Project Damayan (to care for, to help one another)

I: Spirituality of Stewardship (SOS) Program

On August 17, 2019, the CFM Philippines decided to take up again the Spirituality of Stewardship (SoS) into its program. The joy of renewal was so overwhelming that on the same meeting, a Stewardship Committee was formed among the Officers tasked to develop and implement a Stewardship Program.

The CFM Stewardship Program envisions a community of Christian families witnessing to Christ's call to Stewardship as a way of life. To achieve its vision, it shall continuously to evangelize the CFM members on the Spirituality of Stewardship and to enable the members to use their time, talent and treasure, through the various programs and advocacies of the organization. The plans and programs for the next two years were approved by the CFM Board of Directors on February 8, 2020.

In the same meeting, the officers and members of CFM Philippines offered their pledges of treasure in monthly, quarterly and annual basis to the CFM Stewardship Fund. It was a moving ceremony, led with a prayer, each offeror placing his/her pledge in an envelope into a box in front of a crucifix.

II: The SOS "Damayan Project"

On May 1, during the Board of Directors meeting of CFM Philippines, via ZOOM teleconferencing, the idea of making a nationwide inventory of financially-challenged CFM families, or those who were adversely affected by the Covid19 pandemic, and the possibility of forming a "Damayan Project" for them, was discussed.

On May 15, a list of 252 CFM needy families was compiled, based on the reports from our Area Vice-Presidents and Diocesan leaders nationwide. These are families of drivers (pedicabs, tricycles, jeepneys), market vendors, balut vendors, construction workers, tenant farmers, coconut farmers, farm workers, no work no pay workers. Most of these families were just earning around P5,000 (US\$100) or less a month.

These families are from 8 Dioceses -- 25 families from San Jose, Nueva Ecija; 10 from Iba, Zambales; 38 from Pangasinan; 41 from Pampanga; 68 from Malolos and Meycauayan, Bulacan; 4 from Pandacan, Manila; 22 from Cagayan De Oro; and 40 from Zamboanga City.

We believe that our CFM Damayan Project was a huge success, as it was able to help the needy family members of our community.
